Peggy Paige

Peggy Paige was born in London, but taken at a very early age to Canada where she was educated and started her theatrical career—as a member of a successful vaudeville act, the Juvenile Bostonians. On turning to straight acting she appeared in several "Stock" companies in both Canada and the United States, and also toured throughout both countries in the leading role in "Smiling Through". On her return to England she understudied Catherine Lacey and Lilli Palmer in the West End, and then went on to achieve great popularity in Repertory Theatres in such towns as Eastbourne, Swansea, Nottingham, Peterborough and Bradford.

From the last-named she came to the South-East with her husband Richard Burnett to jointly found and direct what became one of the largest Repertory organisations in the country, having played long seasons in nearly twenty different towns. During the last few years, they have limited their activities to towns in the South-East, and are currently presenting Companies at Bexhill and Bognor as well as Folkestone.

Miss Paige has also found time to appear in several films and in nearly a hundred different television programmes, including many plays, educational features and a number of well-known series such as "Home Tonight", "No Hiding Place", "Dr. Finlay's Casebook", "Dixon of Dock Green" and "Z Cars". She has previously made several appearances in Folkestone, and will perhaps be particularly remembered for such plays as "The House by the Lake", "A Question of Fact", "Goodnight Mrs. Puffin", "Roar Like a Dove" and "The Irregular Verb to Love".
