### *Theatre South-East—Profile*

PETER JOLLEY, born in Wimbledon in spite of the Luftwaffe, spent many enjoyable years working in amateur productions of straight plays, comedies and revues before deciding to take up acting as a career. Since joining the profession two and a half years ago, he has appeared in many T.V. productions including "Steptoe and Son", "Play for Today", "The Edwardians", "The Rivals of Sherlock Holmes" and the recent B.B.C. success, "Colditz". He has worked at the Theatre Royal, Windsor where he played 'Careless' in "The School for Scandal" and has toured with a young American Company, playing the lead in two new musicals. Recently, he has worked in John Osborne's latest and most controversial play, "A Sense of Detachment" at the Royal Court Theatre. One of his many ambitions is to write, direct and play in his own play; an ambition he soon hopes to realise. His interests include sailing, tennis and music and a splendid, but rarely obtainable, species of vanilla fudge!

Our play next week, MURDER FOR TWO by Roy Plomley and Robert Thomas, was, under the title of "Double Jeu", a great success in Paris. Robert Thomas is a real all-rounder, actor, director and author of ten or so successful plays including "Trap for a Lonely Man" and we are delighted to have the opportunity of presenting the very first production of the English version, particularly as it is by Roy Plomley whose plays were so popular here last summer.
