JOHN INGRAM

Intended to be an Opera singer and trained with a famous teacher, but after a short spell with Sadlers Wells Opera Company sought an engagement with Robert Atkins at Stratford-upon-Avon to sing the songs in Shakespeares plays but was asked to play Lorenzo in "The Merchant of Venice". Thus he became a "straight" actor.

A desire to play a wide range of parts led him into weekly repertory where he indulged himself for several years including two short stays at Folkestone for Arthur Brough.

Not content with playing an age range from 17 to 77 he also became a director and couldn't make up his mind what he enjoyed doing most, acting or directing, but after a spell of 7 years playing in the West End decided to quit acting and concentrate on directing. Incidentally he reluctantly reveals that he played for 12 months in Agatha Christie's most successful play "The Mousetrap" at the Ambassadors Theatre.

For 4 years he worked for a West End manager as a director, which he describes as a very frustrating period. He has now resolved to find his way back as an actor; his first part was that of David Bliss in "Hay Fever" at this theatre 2 weeks ago, and he looks forward with great pleasure to remaining with the Company for the rest of the season.

THE LEAS PAVILION 1902 to 1976

The Leas Pavilion first opened its doors in 1902—as a Restaurant and Cafe Chantant. The building was constructed below street level because the law of 'ancient lights' by which it is surrounded, did not permit of any building over 8 ft above ground level. The Swiss Restaurateur who was the first manager baked Vienna Rolls and fancy cakes in a great oven which exists to this day beneath the pavement on the Terrace. There was a sprung Dance floor with a Ladies Band—a vocolist and an entertainer to entertain the Patrons. In 1906 the Company introduced Concert Parties and many artists afterwards well known appeared including Leslie Henson, Ronald Frankau and Naunton Wayne, and in 1911 a cinomatograph—tne first cinema in Folkestone, was installed.

Some ten years after the first World War the vogue of Concert Parties was passing and Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Brough then first appeared with a Repertory Company, remaining for the record period of 40 years, and conducting the famous Matinee Teas three times a week—which event is still remembered with affection. Arthur Brough and his wife Elizabeth Addyman retired from active management in 1970 when Richard Burnett and Peggy Paige from Bexhill took over control, The Theatre is now under the management of Robert Howard and the members of his family who are delighted to be able to continue the unbroken record of Theatre presented in the Leas Pavilion for some 45 years.
